April is Sexual Assault Awareness Month

In recognition of Sexual Assault Awareness Month our agency will be taking action by spreading awareness throughout the area. This campaign will include window paintings on the storefronts of local businesses. These window paintings will serve as a visual representation of the ways Bloomsburg and Danville are raising awareness. Additionally, the sidewalks in front of these buildings will be chalked down Main Street in Bloomsburg and Mill Street in Danville in recognition of street harassment; phrases and statistics will be included. Lastly, we will be organizing a poster campaign that will be featured in local bar restrooms that address sexual assault and bystander awareness. Finally, the Medical Advocacy Program will be coordinating Awareness Days at the local hospitals.

The national campaign's theme this year is "It's time to act. Safer campuses. Brighter futures. Prevent sexual violence" focusing on sexual assault prevention on college campuses across the USA. Projects we will be working on to foster this theme include helping Bloomsburg University organize and implement their annual Take Back the Night event for 2015.
